

Some of you will remember Sherm Taylor as the big guy at the Chaffey College Car Show. He was an automotive instructor and ended up wearing many different hats at Chaffey. Last year he was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer and had started treatment. He passed away in March. Sherm had a 440 engine he was selling before his passing. It is still listed in the Nuts & Bolts section of this newsletter. His sister decided to leave it to Chaffey College after his passing so Chaffey will



be using the funds raised towards the scholarship endowment under his name. If you haven't heard about the endowment in his name yet, they started the fundraising a few weeks ago with an initial goal of \$12,000. "The day you stop racing, is the day you win the race." Sherm won his race and took his final victory lap surrounded, at home and in spirit, by loving family. He excelled at everything that matters in life: family, friends, kindness, encouragement and humor. He was the one you could always count on. And countless did.

Sherm was a natural-born "car whisperer." Engines purred for him that sputtered for others. He built championship racing engines and his own winning race cars (always #33). His passion was to share that knowledge with his auto tech students at Chaffey College, earning them national recognition from Skills USA and creating scholarship opportunities by giving life to the Chaffey Car Club. His school bar-b-ques are legendary.

He saw the underdogs, the overlooked, the people with need. And he shared his talents and resources generously. Sherm loved racing, the number 33, slot cars, cats and moose. We don't know why. But "Moose" became his nickname.

Sherm was born in Upland, a graduate of Chaffey College and a master of kindness and generosity. He was preceded in death by his parents, James and Winona Taylor, and sister, Shawna Taylor. Left to cherish his life are sisters Sherilyn Taylor Willis (Skip Willis), Sheila Taylor Corley and his niece and nephew, Jordan Corley and Forrest Corley, to whom he will always be Uncle Moose. # Right in Our Own Backyard submitted by Ken Hamer

According to a report from <u>The Daily Bulletin</u>, the hard work of one depression-era volunteer firefighter from the now defunct Alta Loma Fire Department (ALFD) in Rancho Cucamonga, California, has been given new life by a group of retired firefighters from the same department.

After many years, the fire truck built nearly from scratch by ALFD member and mechanic Arthur Relph back in 1937 has been returned home to what has become the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department (RCFD).

His creation, now 83 years old, arrived by trailer on November 23, 2020, at RCFD's headquarters. Still adorning "Alta Loma Fire Department" on its hood, the pumper was greeted by several former ALFD firefighters and current fire officials. After some refurbishing and a touch of paint, the pumper may become a centerpiece of a future fire museum in the city.

Relph did his handiwork during the dark days of the Great Depression after it became apparent the ALFD's current pumper was too small. The REO Speedwagon (not the rock band, but an actual vehicle built by the REO Motor Car Co.), could carry only about 60 gallons of water, a woefully small amount for extinguishing fires by today's standards.

According to a December 5, 1974, article in the Ontario Daily Report, ALFD volunteers, aware there was no money to purchase a larger pumper, turned to Relph, whose garage was close to the firehouse. Using parts from a 1937 Dodge truck, he assembled the pumper "from a chassis to match a picture the fire department had seen and liked." The finished truck carried a 200-gallon water tank and pump.

The pumper was still in use when the ALFD merged with the RCFD in 1974. Eventually, the truck was pulled from service and later acquired by Relph. Sammy Dominick Sr., a retired firefighter who helped organize the effort to bring the truck back to the RCFD, is looking for a secure location to store the pumper to allow the retired firefighters to work on getting the truck running again.



# Engineers Take On Electric Cars submitted by Jim Froelich

Just received this interesting email today:

An interesting perspective / read for those who think renewable energy concepts are without consequence and especially when air pollution has been reduced by 36% in the last ten years.

As an engineer I love the electric vehicle technology. However, I have been troubled for a long time by the fact that the electrical energy to keep the batteries charged has to come from the grid and that means more power generation and a huge increase in the distribution infrastructure. Whether generated from coal, gas, oil, wind or sun, installed generation capacity is limited.

IF ELECTRIC CARS DO NOT USE GASOLINE, THEY WILL NOT PARTICIPATE IN PAYING A GASOLINE TAX ON EVERY GALLON THAT IS SOLD FOR AUTOMOBILES, WHICH WAS ENACTED SOME YEARS AGO TO HELP TO MAINTAIN OUR ROADS AND BRIDGES. THEY WILL USE THE ROADS, BUT WILL NOT PAY FOR THEIR MAINTENANCE!

In case you were thinking of buying hybrid or an electric car:

Ever since the advent of electric cars, the REAL cost per mile of those things has never been discussed. All you ever heard was the mpg in terms of gasoline, with nary a mention of the cost of electricity to run it. This is the first article I've ever seen and tells the story pretty much as I expected it to.

Electricity has to be one of the least efficient ways to power things yet they're being shoved down our throats. Glad somebody finally put engineering and math to paper.

At a neighborhood BBQ I was talking to a neighbor, a BC Hydro Executive. I asked him how that renewable thing was doing. He laughed, then got serious.

If you really intend to adopt electric vehicles, he pointed out you had to face certain realities. For example, a home charging system for a Tesla requires 75 amp service. The average house is equipped with 100 amp service. On our small street (approximately 25 homes), the electrical infrastructure would be unable to carry more than three houses with a single Tesla each. For even half the homes to have electric vehicles, the system would be wildly over-loaded.

This is the elephant in the room with electric vehicles. Our residential infrastructure cannot bear the load so as our genius elected officials promote this nonsense, not only are we being urged to buy these things and replace our reliable, cheap generating systems with expensive, new windmills and solar cells, but we will also have to renovate our entire delivery system! This latter "investment" will not be revealed until we're so far down this dead end road that it will be presented with an 'OOPS..!' and a shrug.

If you want to argue with a green person over cars that are eco-friendly, just read the following. Note: If you ARE a green person, read it anyway. It's enlightening.

Eric test drove the Chevy Volt at the invitation of General Motors and he writes, "For four days in a row, the fully charged battery lasted only 25 miles before the Volt switched to the reserve gasoline engine". Eric calculated the car got 30 mpg including the 25 miles it ran on the battery. So, the range including the 9-gallon gas tank and the 16 kwh battery is approximately 270 miles.

It will take you 4.5 hours to drive 270 miles at 60 mph. Then add 10 hours to charge the battery and you have a total trip time of 14.5 hours. In a typical road trip your average speed (including charging Time) would be 20 mph.

According to General Motors, the Volt battery holds 16 kwh of electricity. It takes a full 10 hours to charge a drained battery. The cost for the electricity to charge the Volt is never mentioned, so I looked up what I pay for electricity.

I pay approximately (it varies with amount used and the seasons) \$1.16 per kwh. 16 kwh x \$1.16 per kwh = \$18.56 to charge the battery. \$18.56 per charge divided by 25 miles = \$0.74 per mile to operate the Volt using the battery. Compare this to a similar size car with a gasoline engine that gets only 32 mpg. \$3.19 per gallon divided by 32 Mpg = \$0.10 per mile.

The gasoline powered car costs about \$25,000 while the Volt costs \$46,000 plus. Simply pay twice as much for a car that costs more than seven times as much to run, and takes three times longer to drive across the country.





# Ft. Irwin Toy Drive 2021

#### The Bataan Death March

On April 9, 1942 tens of thousands of American and Filipino Soldiers were surrendered to Japanese forces and were forced to march more than 60 miles in the scorching heat through the Philippine jungles. Thousands died and those who survived faced the hardships of prisoner of war camps.

The POWs would not see freedom until 1945 when U.S.-Filipino forces recaptured the lost territory.

During the Bataan Death March, approximately 10,000 men died.

This year marks the 79th Anniversary of the Bataan Death March.
