Probably 100+ vehicles, some with camping trailers, were parked along the campground roads and among the campers. Steve's Dart won an award, which happened to have the front of Bill's car on it from last years show.
- Annual Unholiday Party Saturday March 12<sup>th</sup> wasn't discussed or no minutes taken.

#### April Events

- > April 23<sup>rd</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Corn Feed Run in Chino. So far Bill H, John S, Dave "DC" and Bill & Debbie are going. 8am 3 pm, \$40 mail-in by 4/13 online, \$45 day of show. Voted as the Club Activity for the month of April.
- > April 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring Fling at Woodley Park in Van Nuys. Jim F. mentioned that the other club he is a member of, CPW, has had a 30% increase this year in preregistrations for Spring Fling. Leo T will be going out as a swapper with his hinge repair items and will have Mopars in May flyers.
- > April 29th & 30th Show and Go in downtown Riverside. Bill and Debbie going.
- > April 30<sup>th</sup> Grace Yokley School Music Car Show in Ontario. Benefits the school music program. So far Mike and Bill are going.
- May 28<sup>th</sup> A Flag for Every Hero at the Riverside National Cemetery. Ken was contacted on March 22<sup>nd</sup> by the organization that runs the event called "Honoring Our Fallen" about sponsoring some flags. Ken let us know about cost which is .75 each. The club voted to buy 200 flags for \$150. Sam gave Ken a check to send. Getting back to "Honoring Our Fallen", should we offer them a free spot at the Mopars in May show to solicit funds for their organization? Club voted yes.
- Mopars in May May 15<sup>th</sup> at the Southwest Carpenters Training Center in Ontario.

- Registrations as of April 3<sup>rd</sup> (cont)
  - 10 show car mail-in registrations: 5 Classic and 5 Modern. Also had 1 swapper, 1 vendor, 4 food vendors.
  - We need to check with Jason on what information he may already have.
- > Paul contacted Ken and volunteered to be the car show chairman. The attending members approved, voting yes. Ken suggested that Paul be a coordinator of the show, with positive support for the show from the members.
- > Ken asked Mike if Fort Irwin has any volunteers yet. Hadn't heard yet.
- > Ken also asked if San Diego Mopar's would have any help for us as well. Mike was aware of 3 judges so far.
- > DC passed on his show ideas to Paul.
- Paul suggested that he would assign the different activities and those people would handle all aspects of it.
  - Lonnie is almost done with all the trophy's but didn't want to handle the plaque sponsors or handling the money. \$25 to sponsor each. Barbara T. offered to do that.
  - Jim suggested a 5-person committee to do the logistics work for the show. Paul suggested a planning meeting at his house next weekend at 1pm.
- > It was suggested that we contact the car show DJ about bringing more speakers this year. Last year there were only 2 speakers and they were on one side of the show (NOT TRUE). So the music was very loud in that area and couldn't be heard in the other.
- Leo brought up that the car show registrations were being cut off about a month before the show and was concerned that we would be limiting the number of cars that could be in the show too much and we need as many cars as possible. And that this was a fundraising event and he felt we were cutting off too many opportunities to raise more funds. Mike said that we needed the lead time to make sure that we had enough time for t-shirts to be printed for those who pre-registered. Sam suggested that maybe we didn't need t-shirts for everyone if that limited registration time. Leo said that we seem to just be limiting ourselves on more and more stuff.
- Front gate: Debbie said "when you get people to come up to the front to help and you get everyone to do what they need to do, because, it's a lot. I've done it 20 years and we get people who say they will help and they don't". Leo said that is why we need to try to get a stronger commitment than just an email reply.
- > Ken said that Joey needs to get Paul's name on the show flyer instead of Jason's. Mike said he would update the flyer and send it to Joey.
- > Paul passed out a duty sheet so people could write down what they want to do.

#### Round Table:




There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:18 am.

# Hot Wheels crowns a new Legends Tour winner to be turned into a die-cast model

For the second year in a row, the <u>Hot Wheels Legends Tour</u> picked one car to be immortalized as a 1:64 scale die-cast toy car at the SEMA Show. This time around, the finalists came from 20 different car shows in the United States and Mexico. The grand prize went to this 1957 Nash Metropolitan, built by Greg Salzillo and Greg Ford. The finalist judging panel was packed with automotive celebrities, including Jay Leno, Adam Carolla, Richard Rawlings, Dave Marek, and Peter Brock.

## **Next Rambo Project? (cont)**

This little Nash Metro has a small block Chevy 305 under the hood, making around 300 horsepower, with headers poking out of the front fenders. It also has bias-ply tires sticking clear of the bodywork, and, of course, the big pair of dice air cleaners atop the twin carburetors. The car was briefly purchased by Richard Rawlings to appear on an episode of *Fast N' Loud*, but when those plans fell through, the two Gregs bought the car back





Is that too much motor for the tires? Does the exhaust dump exhaust fumes right in through the windows? The answer is that it doesn't matter. The cars on the Legends Tours are meant to be real-life Hot Wheels, so practicality isn't as much of a factor as creativity. The finalist were selected from each of the regional shows, each judged on an equally weighted five factors: The Hot Wheels Story behind your build, design, authenticity, garage spirit, and performance and fun.

## Van T Barfoot died... submitted by Pat from Old Farts

Remember the guy who wouldn't take the flag pole down on his Virginia property a while back? You might remember the news story several months ago about a crotchety old man in Virginia who defied his local Homeowners Association, and refused to take down the flag pole on his property along with the large American flag he flew on it.

Now we learn who that old man was.

On June 15, 1919, Van T. Barfoot was born in Edinburg, Texas. That probably didn't make news back Then. But twenty-five years later, on May 23, 1944, near Carano, Italy, that same Van T. Barfoot, who had in 1940 enlisted in the U.S. Army, set out alone to flank German machine gun positions from which gunfire was raining down on his fellow soldiers.

His advance took him through a minefield but having done so, he proceeded

to single-handedly take out three enemy machine gun positions, returning with 17 prisoners of war.

And if that weren't enough for a day's work, he later took on and destroyed three German tanks sent to retake the machine gun positions.

That probably didn't make much news either, given the scope of the war, but it did earn Van T. Barfoot, who retired as a Colonel after also serving In Korea and Vietnam, a well deserved Congressional Medal of Honor.

What did make news...was his Neighborhood Association's quibble with how the 90-year-old veteran chose to fly the American flag outside his suburban Virginia home. Seems the HOA rules said it was OK to fly a flag on a house-mounted bracket, but, for decorum, items such as Barfoot's 21-foot flagpole were "unsuitable".

Van Barfoot had been denied a permit for the pole, but erected it anyway and was facing court action unless he agreed to take it down.

Then the HOA Story made national TV, and the Neighborhood Association rethought its position and agreed to indulge this aging hero who dwelt among them.

"In the Time I have left", he said to the Associated Press, "I plan to continue to fly the American flag without interference."

As well he should. And if any of his neighbors had taken a notion to contest him further, they might have done well to read his Medal of Honor citation first. Seems it indicates Mr. Van Barfoot wasn't particularly good at backing down.
