## The Howl of the Hellcat, The Wail of the Banshee

One of the initial reasons I've heard people say why they don't care for electric vehicles (EVs) is, "They have no soul, no personality, no sound." Well, maybe Dodge is changing part of that.

On August 17, Dodge introduced the world to its first battery electric vehicle and the next generation of the legendary Charger nameplate. The Dodge Charger Daytona SRT Concept BEV "roared" to life and made it clear that if the brand that brought us the Hellcat cars had to make an EV, they are going to do everything possible to make it more interesting than any other EV on the market. And this Charger debuted as a two-door design.

Although they didn't release any power or performance numbers, or pricing, Dodge stated that this Charger EV - which debuted in the topof-the-line Banshee trim - will beat the current Hellcat cars in every performance category. The Hellcat Challenger is marketed as being able to run an 11.20-second quarter mile and hit 199 miles per hour. So are we to expect this concept car to be capable of 10s at the dragstrip and 200 miles per hour? That's pretty heady territory.



The plan is for this Charger EV to be offered with two powertrain configurations - a 400 volt system and an 800 volt system. There will be three trim levels available at dealerships, all of which come standard with all-wheel drive, and Direct Connection will offer two performance upgrade packages for each of the three trim lines. Those power upgrades will be added via software and hardware changes by Direct Connection/Power Broker dealerships.

The Banshee also features the new Dodge PowerShot feature which allows up to 15 seconds of peak power output. This system is controlled by a button on the steering wheel and, provided the battery is charged properly, the driver can use this feature over and over with short rest periods between uses.

Maybe the most unique feature of the Dodge electric powertrain, and makes it so unique from other EVs, is the exhaust system. An EV with an exhaust? The Fratzonic Chambered Exhaust system creates a unique tone, and while it acts like a gasoline engine's exhaust in terms of idling and revving, it isn't a speaker under the car that plays Hemi sounds. Dodge created a truly unique sound that is unlike anything ever heard. The "wail of the Banshee" reaches 126 decibels, just as loud as the Hellcat cars, but with its own, specific sound. The Dodge EV literally screams at everyone it passes and offers the same "screw you" attitude as the gas-powered cars of today.

Inland Mopars continues to ask for volunteers for our Vice President club officer position, and a continuing need for volunteers to assist with our social media presence (Facebook, Instagram). We need a social media presence to reach out to potential new younger members.
