

It was still pretty dark at 5am as the gates to the Ontario Carpenters Training Center were being unlocked. The 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Mopars in May Car Show was underway. Lots to unload from the trailer and set up since we were starting with a blank canvas, er, car show area, which had been measured and marked the day before. Okay, not quite blank but empty. Pat Osterman from Old Farts Racing Team met us there with his truck filled with canopies and tables for the raffle area. Thanks once again for providing these items at 5am in the morning.

This year, in addition to judging help from the Mopar Club San Diego, we had parking, gate, & judging help from volunteers from South Bay Mopars, Chrysler Performance West and Mopar Larry. Judging would probably still be going on if we didn't have everyone's help. Thanks to all who volunteered. It is a bitch getting old and having help from half a club.

The gate opened early to accommodate swappers. Vendors were parked as they arrived. The Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 1024 came in with their Vietnam era helicopter display. The one disappointment we had was a couple of days before the show we heard the army lawyers had disapproved our request for a color guard for the event. It only took 90+ days for them to make that decision, even though the color guard was able to be there the year before.

The LifeStream Blood Bank bloodmobile pulled in and got set up. It was encouraging to actually have people anxious to donate. At the end of the day, it was a little disappointing to find out there were a total of nine donations. A couple of them were double red so there were 11 pints collected. It should have been more with the shortage of blood these days. Thank you to those who took the time help save a life. Plus, there was that drawing for the \$300 custom pin striped  $2\frac{1}{2}$  pound halon fire extinguisher pin striped by Ron of Ron's Colorworks in Upland. With only nine donations you had a pretty good chance of taking it home.

Mopars in May 2023 was our first Toy Drive event for the Military Kids at Fort Irwin this year and kicked off the next seven months of toy collecting. The show brought in seven boxes of toys, a start towards gathering toys for over 3000 kids. Anyone who donated a toy got a raffle ticket that could be used in the general opportunity drawing or the special drawing for another \$300 custom pin striped  $2\frac{1}{2}$  pound halon fire extinguisher pin striped by Ron at Ron's Colorworks in Upland.

The custom awards were once again created by Lonnie & Robin Clabaugh and were highly sought after. More photos to come. Rumor has it they have retired from award making.

## **Fort Irwin Change of Command Ceremony**

As Ken mentioned in his President's Message, we went to Fort Irwin to witness the Change of Command Ceremony from Col. Clarke to Col. Bomar. In all the years we had been associated with Fort Irwin through the toy drive for Christmas in January, I don't remember ever being invited to this ceremony. We may have been, but since it takes place in the middle of the week and some of us were still working, it would have been difficult to attend. Ken did manage to get a vacation day and I managed to get up early for the two-hour drive.

After an invocation and presentation of flowers to the wives and children of the incoming and outgoing garrison commanders, the ceremony itself starts with the color guard presenting colors. Command Sgt. Maj. Palmer, garrison senior enlisted advisor, moved in front of the color guard. Ms. Brenda McCullough, Director Installation Management Command - Readiness, outgoing garrison commander Col. Clarke, and incoming garrison commander Col. Bomar move to face the colors. Command Sgt. Maj. Palmer receives the U.S Army Garrison Fort Irwin colors from the color guard. He then hands the flag to outgoing garrison commander Col. Clarke. He in turn hands the flag to Ms. McCullough who in turn hands the flag to incoming garrison commander Col. Bomar. Col. Bomar completes the circle by handing the flag back to Command Sgt. Maj. Palmer who returns the flag to the color guard. You need to watch the short video at the link below to appreciate the significance of what seems like a simple passing of a flag between four people and the color guard. Every movement has a meaning.

After the formal act of passing the garrison colors, Brigadier General Taylor, Ms. McCullough, Col. Clarke and Col. Bomar said a few words. This basically ended the formal ceremony. A greeting line was formed by Col. Bomar and his family at the Heritage Center while a farewell line was formed to say goodby to Col. Clarke and his wife.

Then it was off to In-N-Out for brunch and the drive home.




## LifeStream Blood Bank Placentia Donor Center Closing


Our final day of operations at PLDC will be Tuesday, July 18.




