
Toy drive donation box location

Grand National Roadster Show (GNRS) Reminder



We will again be working the GNRS as the annual club fund raiser. For those newer members, the GNRS had been held the last weekend in January but changed to the first weekend in February a year ago due to the NFL lengthened season. It is where the America's Most Beautiful Roadster trophy is awarded so there are some high dollar cars there. Don't be confused by the name of the show thinking this is an all-roadster show. The show is open to all kinds of vehicles.

Our role in this show is we work the souvenir booth. A couple of days prior to the show for set up & early sales plus for the three days the show is open. We usually take the show hours each day, add an hour before opening, and then split it in half. It usually ends up being $4\frac{1}{2}$ to $5\frac{1}{2}$ hours. It isn't hard work but it can get crazy busy on Friday & Saturday. If you work the booth, you get free parking as well as entry into the show so plan on viewing the cars either before or after your shift.

We also do an Inland Mopars club display with 3-4 member cars on display inside the secure building for the weekend. This year's display cars belong to Bill & Debbie Whitson, 1964 Plymouth Fury and Bill Heckman, 1966 Dodge Coronet, along with our newest member Steve Ruiz, 1969 Dodge Dart. We have a couple of event flyer racks in the display for Mopar events as well as open show events. 














Mopars & Friends at MoTech Performance

Fort Irwin Toy Drive

It is best to be at the planning stages so the toy drive info gets on the promotional materials and flyers otherwise no one knows to bring a toy.

We will also be looking for businesses that would like to have a toy donation box at their business location. This works best where the business has a lot of repeat foot traffic. Restaurants work well so if you have a favorite, let me know. We had tried CDJR dealerships but most didn't have the repeat traffic or box placed where it would be seen.

As you can see from the schedule below, the toy drive consumes months of planning and coordination between clubs, businesses, toy donation box locations, as well as Fort Irwin. Planning started a while ago for 2023. We did lose J&M Speed Center in Riverside when they closed in March but the Riverside Cars & Coffee cruise is still taking place at the J&M site. 
